

Mrs. Geiger's September Newsletter – 2007

Dear Parents,

Welcome to Faith Preschool! Thank you for sharing your child with us. We are looking forward to a wonderful year full of fun and special learning experiences.

During the month of September, we will be busy getting acquainted with new friends and becoming more familiar with our new surroundings. We will be discovering the importance of sharing, helping, and being kind to one another. Later in the month, we will be exploring the 5 senses and how they help us learn. We will introduce the basic shapes and colors through games, stories and art projects.

Please praise and display your child's artwork. If your child comes home with no artwork, it only means we are keeping the artwork to decorate our room, or the artwork was not finished. This is especially true of our painting projects. They may need more time to dry. These projects will be sent home as soon as possible.

We ask that you send your child to school in comfortable play clothes. We will be painting and cooking, and although we do wear smocks, we sometimes get a bit messy. We also suggest a sturdy tennis shoe, as we will be climbing and running during our large muscle playtime.

Red Day is September 13. We are asking each child to bring in something red to show to the class. This item can be a toy or any unbreakable item that will fit inside your child's schoolbag. Please put your child's name on that item to make certain it is returned to the correct child at dismissal time. We also ask that your child wear something red to reinforce our color of the month. Since we are teaching the children the colors in Spanish, I will be giving you a Spanish color each month in the newsletter so that you may practice with your child. Our Spanish color of the month is rojo (pronounced roho) for red.

Please remember to read your child's newsletter every month. It contains important dates and information as to what your child will be doing each month.

If your child should come home without a nametag, it simply means Mrs. Grottl and I feel comfortable that we know your child's name. We use the nametags for various activities during the school year.
